Let's Talk Lowell Community Conversation Summary

April 24, 2025 - 6pm to 8pm | Venue: LTC - 246 Market St Lowell MA

Participants were broken into three tables with a volunteer facilitator at each table to help record the conversation, keep it on track, and encourage everyone to share while being respectful of others. After a presentation, tables were assigned topics:

Session 1

- Lowell Communications Hub
- Machine Shop Square/Millyard
- Immigrant Volunteerism and Advocacy

Session 2

- Downtown Revitalization
- Transportation
- Homes and Housing

After one "session," participants were invited to shift tables to have a new mix of people. These notes start with high-level recommendations, then summaries of each topic. Full transcripts of each table are at the end of the notes.

NEXT STEPS & RECOMMENDATIONS

General Topics

Downtown Revitalization: Key takeaways included:

- Need to strengthen coordination between existing efforts and events
- Need to coordinate trash pick-up to create a cleaner downtown
- Opportunity to utilize alleys by cleaning them up, decorating them, and adding string lights
- Possibility of extending string lights across streets to create tunnels of lights
- Inviting City economic development and experts in the Business Improvement District

Housing: Key takeaways included:

- We need to learn more about on Accessory Dwelling Units, eventually developing a resource guide related to ADUs, including permitting, financing, accessibility, and requirements, possibly updating existing resources
- We also need to learn more about the bill “Yes in God’s Backyard,” including the possible benefits and concerns
- Lowell’s Zoning is an additional research need
- ADU experts and advocates could be a possible opportunity to be a special guest, along with elected officials who supported efforts such as ADUs or YIGBY

Transportation: Key takeaways included:

- One of the key missing areas is improvement in pedestrian/walking
- Idea to do a walking audit to identify areas of unsafe staircases on sidewalks and paths, possible a “volunteer weekend” to do group walk audits with a report on which are the worse
- Learning about what happened to the Veotide Bicycle Project and how we can use those lessons learned to create a bicycle system
- Need to improve the bus rider application
- Possible opportunity to invite traffic engineer

Community Action Ideas

Communication Hub: To improve communications, we should continue to learn how we can use the new Merrimack Valley Convention and Visitor Bureau Visitor Center as a spot to share information and market Lowell, including promoting their Ambassador program. Working with this group, we can share information about Lowell events outside of Lowell, and share the other communities’ events within Lowell, both at the Visitor Center and with a regional calendar. We could invite stakeholders who work on community calendars to join future events such as Lowell Cultural Affairs and Special Events and Mosaic Lowell to our next meeting.

Immigration Advocacy: The next steps include research about needs around job authorization, access to information, and rights and resources for immigrants – including training opportunities. Lists of nonprofits and churches can be shared and built upon. A number of key stakeholders could be invited including MIRA, Northeast Justice Center, RISE Coalition, and others.

Machine Shop Square: The goal is to create a special downtown outdoor area that could replicate the successes of Mill No. 5 – including marketing, sense of place, and regular programming – while avoiding the challenges of Mill No. 5 – such as physical disconnection from downtown and a cultural disconnect from Lowell. First steps toward this goal could be to research ownership and feasibility of programming various open spaces around Market Mills, creating a temporary “trail” with stenciled chalk/spraypaint icons leading from the HCID garage to or beyond Market Street, researching history for pop-up signs, and researching how well businesses did in Mill No. 5 and how well other efforts such as the CTI farmer’s market is going. The trail could be spraypainted at the same “volunteer weekend” as the walk audit described in the transportation group.

Immigrant Volunteerism and Advocacy:

- Research, Train/Prep, Invite
- Identify work opportunities (for those without work permits)
- Ensure access to information and resources to support the process of work, housing
- Basic rights; work permits; housing; multilingual support
- MIRA – Organization has resources/info existing
- Online demand due to concerns
- Rep Howard put together list of churches in city
 - Perhaps identify immigrant friendly churches
 - Build relationships with those churches
 - Look into friendly organizations/businesses as well
 - Existing policies that are welcoming
 - With policies in response to ICE
- Public education resources for parents (i.e., financial classes, language)
- Concern: information access
 - Hand out info/resources
 - Ensure local churches/orgs provide/have access to resources
 - Social media – signal
 - Safe community members volunteer to become knowledgeable and assist (i.e., download brochures/info from MIRA; be trained on resources)
