Food & Alcohol Permitting:

- Finding food funding can be a challenge

Funding and Institutional Support:

- Concern with Enterprise changing to Rockland Trust
 - Will access still be given for the water access to fill water weights for tents
 - Same facilities person will still be present
 - Mosaic Lowell agreed to send out information regarding the access for water weights
- Lowell Cultural Council will have an open grants cycle
 - MCC has relaxed their rules
 - You can now submit food related reimbursements now (this is new)
 - o Alcohol reimbursements are not provided
- Is funding still consistent or has this been impacted by current administration
 - o We're still seeing robust engagement on the state side
 - o It appears the state budget appears to be similar
 - Historically Lowell has done well from allocation from the Massachusetts Cultural Council grants
- Mosaic Lowell is working with Lowell Cultural Council on specific workshops that will help address priorities for upcoming funding cycles
 - o This usually will be announced in August; open in September; close in December?

- Massachusetts Cultural Council (MCC) has been very responsive on feedback
 - o Mosaic Lowell will include the MCC Grant Cycle Information in an upcoming email

Upcoming Festivals and Events

- Open Streets Lowell testing this festival / event
 - Target date: October 4th
 - o Close portion of Merrimack St. from Noon to 4pm
 - Still awaiting quote from city
 - o If we meet a certain threshold of fundraising we will close the streets
 - If we do not meet a certain threshold of fundraising we will continue the event, yet do it in side areas and on sidewalks
 - We could have this be a launching moment to raise funds to develop funds to close the streets and create a pedestrian street scape
 - o Partnering with local colleges to encourage students to come downtown
 - Looking for vendors resource tables, promotional tables, nonprofit tables, small business, crafts, etc.
 - Community driven event
- Fundraising
 - Finding ways to connect with people
 - o Finding ways to educate people on what we're doing within DIY Lowell
 - o Multiple facets of involvement
- DIY Lowell 10th Annual Gala
 - Still awaiting venue confirmation
- Events Vendors / Venues
 - o Difficulty with timely communication
 - o Hard to receive confirmations to move forward with planning and budget planning
 - Many are experiencing these issues
 - Many places are facing staffing shortages
- Hispanic Festivals
 - Would love to see more Hispanic Festivals
 - El Salvador Festival (August 26?)
 - Puerto Rican Festival (August 3?)
- Folk Festival
 - o Merchandise sold online and at the event
 - Pricing TBD
 - Seeking Long-Term Office/Admin volunteer currently
 - Mosaic Lowell suggested student volunteers yet this doesn't address consistency
 - Internships might be possible yet are not always reliable
 - CASE suggested speaking to Lowell Senior Center for potential volunteers that could provide a better consistency in coverage
 - Doesn't need to be the same person, just needs to be consistent in coverage
 - Pre-event work is not exciting or easy to recruit volunteers
 - Mosaic Lowell suggested Levi with Community Connections perhaps
 - Mosaic Lowell agreed to introduce Folk Festival to Community Connections
 - Lowell Senior Center agreed to share volunteer opportunities
 - Recruiting Planning Committee Members
 - Our board is great at what they do
 - Yet not necessarily great at recruiting new members

Lowell Fest Force and Volunteer Needs

Lowell Fest Force

- Volunteer platform for community events & festivals
- Creation of Lowell Fest Force Ambassador volunteer position
- Approximately 50 to 60 people on the list
 - Currently receive virtual badge for volunteering
- We're seeking more festival and community events that want to be listed within this
 platform to develop a robust series of events volunteers could take part
- Has its own stand-alone website currently
- Mosaic Lowell could list on their website
- There are needs for volunteers for other events we need these event organizers to join the Lowell Fest Force
- Call to Action: Event organizers list your event on Lowell Fest Force page
 - Send a one paragraph description of your festival and a link to your volunteer opportunities
 - Newsletter will go out monthly with upcoming volunteer opportunities
 - Send a graphic/logo for your event if possible
 - Lowell Fest Force will table at your event to check in volunteers or a QR code can be provided for volunteers to be required to check in at the event
- Many events have a strong need for planning committee members
 - This is hard to fill these roles as most planning committee members are long-term and at some point burn out or need to move on yet planning committees are hard to backfill
 - Potential training for board members that learn about how to volunteer with planning committees
 - ☐ A matchmaking training opportunity for local leaders/board members/volunteers to learn how to work on an event planning committee
 - ☐ Board Diversity Training provided by Lowell Plan might be something to model off of for this
 - Having multiple ambassadors that represent the diversity of Lowell to better access new volunteers
 - Many planning committees also volunteer in other ways; yet not always
 - What is the appropriate level of commitment for planning committee members?
 - How do you get new people involved?
 - Succession Planning is so important
 - People want to know what they can do and give them opportunities to grow
 - ☐ If volunteers want continued involvement, encourage more intrinsic and long-lasting opportunities to help grow the event
 - Ensure there is a wealth of different volunteer opportunity types available for various community events and festivals
 - The Time Exchange was a local platform that helped promote volunteer opportunities before that no longer exists
 - How to promote opportunities
 - ☐ Market opportunities with existing volunteer quotes, video clips, and other insights to encourage involvement
- Revolutionary Valley is working with a new volunteer software that may be something that aligns well with this current platform
 - o This software provides a method to sub-divide into different categories or program offerings
 - o This software is data-driven
 - o This might help address the data problem, calendar problem, and volunteer problem that has a lot of overlap
 - o Having a software that can help manage the volunteer data would be helpful
- Lowell Celebrates Kerouac
 - o How do you maintain continuity on one hand and also remain innovative

- o Our meetings are open to all
- o People come and go
- o There is no magic formula, yet there is a balance
- o New members should have a stake in it; so that they are motivated
- Yet current and long-lasting members also need to be willing to maintain continuity and open to innovation
- Succession Planning is so important
- o People want to know what they can do and give them opportunities to grow
 - If volunteers want continued involvement, encourage more intrinsic and long-lasting opportunities to help grow the event

Other Ideas and Thoughts: Lowell needs more parades!

- CASE says Lowell is not a parade friendly city because the city streets are not adequate for parades
- CASE says Lowell has a lot of existing parades yet these are hard to plan
